



K.R. Mangalam University advances Sustainable Development Goal 17 by forging strategic, cross-sectoral partnerships that amplify research, teaching, community outreach and applied solutions. The University collaborates with national and international academic institutions, industry partners, governmental bodies and civil society organizations to promote knowledge exchange, resource mobilization and joint action for sustainable development.

Through Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs), joint research projects, academic exchanges, conferences and value-based programmes, KRMU cultivates platforms that bring together diverse stakeholders to tackle complex societal challenges. Flagship activities including multidisciplinary conferences, peace and value-education programmes, community adoption and environment drives translate partnerships into measurable outcomes such as internships, skill-building opportunities, community interventions and policy-facing research.

KRMU's documented MoUs and collaborations cover a spectrum of activities: academic exchanges (international and national), industry skilling and incubation, community engagement and NGO partnerships, forensic and professional certificate programmes, and sports and cultural collaborations. Collectively these partnerships align with SDG-17 targets reinforcing global cooperation, technology and capacity-building linkages and multi-stakeholder partnerships for implementation. The University's continued emphasis on evidence-backed partnerships ensures that collaborative activity is auditable and reportable enabling KRMU to map partnerships to specific SDG targets and report progress in institutional SDG frameworks.



SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals

17.1 Research into partnerships for the goals

K.R. Mangalam University demonstrates a strong commitment to SDG 17 – Partnerships for the Goals, emphasizing collaborative research that strengthens global, regional, and local partnerships to achieve sustainable development. Between 2014 and 2024, the university produced 1,042 Scopus-indexed publications, of which 53 publications are directly aligned with SDG 17. These works collectively received 1,306 citations, with a citation index of 24.64, reflecting the high impact and recognition of the university's research in fostering collaborative solutions for sustainable development challenges.

17.1.1: Proportion of Output Co-Authored with Low or Lower-Middle-Income Countries

In 2024, K.R. Mangalam University recorded 7 publications co-authored with researchers from low-income countries and 53 publications with middle-income countries. These collaborations underscore the university's proactive approach in building international partnerships that enhance knowledge sharing, capacity building, and research innovation. By engaging with partners from diverse economic regions, the university ensures that its research contributions are globally relevant and inclusive, thereby supporting equitable development outcomes.

17.1.2: Partnerships for the Goals – Publications

The 53 SDG 17-aligned publications represent the university's sustained efforts to develop multi-stakeholder research networks involving academia, industry, government, and civil society. These publications focus on themes such as sustainable development strategies, resource management, policy integration, and global cooperation frameworks. The robust citation performance highlights the academic credibility and influence of these collaborative studies.

Through these interdisciplinary and internationally connected research initiatives, K.R. Mangalam University continues to promote the importance of partnerships in achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. By strengthening research networks and



sharing expertise across borders, the university plays a significant role in advancing SDG 17, reinforcing its global presence and impact.

17.2 Relationships to support the goals

17.2.1 Relationships with regional NGOs and government for SDG policy

Strengthening SDG Policy through Regional Collaborations

K.R. Mangalam University (KRMU) has emerged as a key regional stakeholder in SDG-led development by building strong collaborative relationships with NGOs, civil society organizations, and government agencies. These engagements ensure that academic knowledge is translated into practical action and contributes meaningfully to local policy frameworks.

During 2023–24, the University collaborated with organisations such as Smiling Tree Foundation, Human Touch, Save Aravali Trust, Sociwind Foundation, and Heartfulness, aligning its expertise with regional sustainability agendas. These partnerships advanced policy-relevant interventions in areas such as environmental restoration, gender equality, mental health, educational inclusivity, livelihood enhancement, and community resilience. Through these engagements, KRMU not only facilitated awareness and skill development but also generated field insights that inform local SDG strategies.

In addition, the University partnered with the District Commissioner's Office, Gurugram, under an MoU aimed at the social upliftment of five nearby villages, working closely with panchayats, Anganwadi workers, and local institutions. Through faculty research, student-led projects, capacity-building workshops, and extension programmes, the University contributed evidence-based recommendations that support ongoing state and district-level SDG planning.

The University's outreach in villages such as Ghamroj, Garhi Bazidpur, Berka, Lakhuwas, Kharoda, Nuh, and Ghanghola has further strengthened its role as a bridge between policy and practice. Priority areas include health education, sustainable livelihoods, entrepreneurship, women empowerment, environmental stewardship, technical skill-building, and social inclusion. The insights and data emerging from these community programmes are continuously shared with partner NGOs and local government stakeholders, enabling more responsive policies that reflect community realities.



By maintaining active dialogue with policymakers, conducting joint initiatives with development agencies, and anchoring its fieldwork in SDG metrics, KRMU plays a significant role in regional policy support and SDG localization. These ongoing collaborations model how higher education institutions can foster sustainable development by empowering communities, strengthening governance linkages, and co-creating solutions for inclusive growth.

Recognising that sustainable development requires interdisciplinary collaboration, KRMU has actively initiated and participated in platforms that promote interaction among educators, legal practitioners, policymakers, social organisations, and industry experts. These engagements provide a space for collective reflection, idea exchange, and co-creation of solutions that address real-world sustainability challenges.



The University's efforts during the academic year included a series of faculty development programmes, research conferences, student-centric workshops, and community outreach drives all of which integrated sustainability perspectives aligned with the SDGs.

Key Initiatives Fostering Cross-Sectoral Dialogue

- **Conferences and Research Forums:** International and national conferences such as “Vision 2030: Emerging Trends in Interdisciplinary Research and Practices”, “Embracing Diversity: Exploring Third Gender Marriages and Gender Equality”, and KRMU PHYSIOCON 2024 brought together academicians, researchers, practitioners, and policymakers to deliberate on inclusive, equitable, and sustainable growth frameworks. These forums encouraged collaborative thought on SDGs related to Quality Education (SDG 4), Gender Equality (SDG 5), Good Health and Well-Being (SDG 3), and Reduced Inequalities (SDG 10).

- **Industry-Academia Collaborations:** Guest lectures, expert sessions, and alumni talk such as “Power Seminar on AI and Cloud Computing”, “Corporate Culture and Placement Training”, and “Career Counselling on Futuristic International Opportunities” facilitated exchanges with industry leaders and entrepreneurs, promoting Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8) and Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure (SDG 9).
- **Faculty Development and Research Training:** FDPs on “Research Methodology and Artificial Intelligence”, “Meaningful Research and Intellectual Property Rights”, and “Interdisciplinary Qualitative Research” created platforms for inter-institutional



collaboration, building the capacity of faculty and scholars to integrate SDG-based research frameworks into their disciplines.

Impact and Outcomes

Through these engagements, K.R. Mangalam University has nurtured a culture of collaborative responsibility and shared vision towards achieving the SDGs. 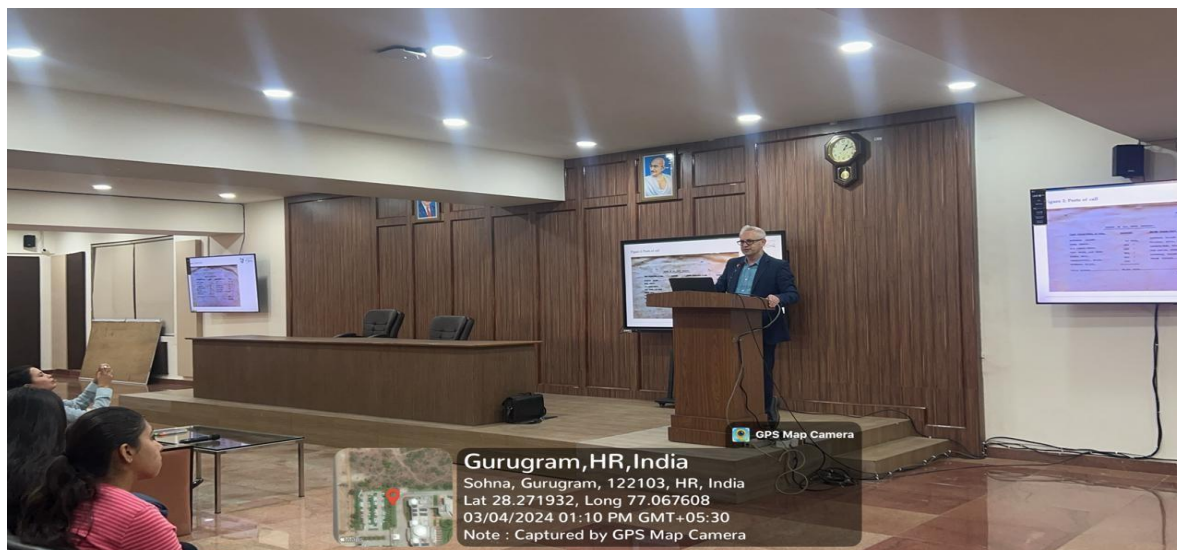

Events Conducted in Collaboration

K.R. Through alliances with organisations such as **Capital Mentor, TIME, AECC Global, Vigyan Prasar, Oracle India, DLSA, World Comics India, Four Points by Sheraton, Infogain, Communifix, SPA Delhi, Imagine XP, and AajTak**, students receive **direct exposure to professional ecosystems**, global career pathways, entrepreneurship development, legal awareness, and civic responsibility.

These partnerships go beyond one-time interactions—they create a **continuous knowledge-sharing ecosystem** that connects academia with real-time industry developments and governance mechanisms. Alumni engagements further strengthen institutional networking by linking higher education outcomes with workplace realities. Workshops on journalism ethics, constitutional responsibilities, women's rights, and legal-technological integration were facilitated in association with **government bodies like DLSA**, demonstrating youth engagement in nation building.

Similarly, culinary heritage workshops, hospitality sessions, agriculture awareness events, and digital skills training illustrate how **cross-sectoral collaboration fosters interdisciplinary learning**, employability and cultural sustainability, aligned with SDG targets 17.16 and 17.17 which emphasize “effective public, public-private and civil society partnerships.”

Collectively, these events reflect the university's commitment to building a future-ready student community through **collaboration-driven learning**, ensuring that knowledge sharing is reinforced through sustained external partnerships. Thus, the University actively contributes to **SDG 17 by creating an enabling platform for academic-industry-NGO-government synergy** that strengthens institutional capacity, graduate outcomes, and societal development.

Furthermore, by partnering with NGOs, legal bodies like **District Legal Services Authority (DLSA)**, and alumni working globally across sectors, the institution supports **SDG 17.4.2**, promoting **institutional learning through external resource-sharing**. These collaborations also create a two-way ecosystem where industry and society benefit from student participation, social awareness, and innovation.



Workshops on constitutional duties, women's rights advocacy, digital verification in journalism, agriculture-based livelihoods, culinary heritage preservation, and AI-law intersections strengthen public governance awareness and civic responsibility through multi-sector engagement. The culinary, agriculture, legal and entrepreneurship events also highlight **cross-sectoral partnerships**, embedding sustainable practices, cultural knowledge, and professional mentorship into academic life.

17.2.5 Collaboration with NGOs and Government Organizations for SDGs

K.R. Mangalam University actively engages students through the National Service Scheme (NSS) and Youth Red Cross (YRC) units to advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These platforms foster civic engagement, humanitarian values, and leadership among students while promoting partnerships with NGOs and government bodies for impactful community development.

Through NSS, students participate in extensive outreach and awareness programmes in collaboration with organizations such as the Uboonto Foundation, S.M. Sehgal Foundation, and the Gender Sensitization Committee, as well as under national initiatives like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Meri Mati Mera Desh, and Poshan Abhiyaan. Major activities include plantation drives with the Smiling Tree Foundation, menstrual hygiene awareness in Berka Village, and cleanliness and waste management campaigns in Lakhuwas and Ghamroj villages. These efforts align with SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), and SDG 13 (Climate Action) by improving health literacy, promoting gender awareness, and fostering environmental sustainability.

The Youth Red Cross (YRC) collaborates closely with the District Red Cross Society, Gurugram, and Haryana State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society to organize humanitarian and health-centered initiatives. Key programmes include drug de-addiction awareness, road safety sessions, TB Mukht Bharat surveys, blood donation camps, and village medical check-up camps. Students also participated in state- and national-level YRC training camps, gaining exposure to disaster preparedness, first aid, and community leadership. These collaborations directly support SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).

Through these sustained efforts, K.R. Mangalam University integrates volunteerism with education, nurturing students as socially responsible citizens committed to sustainable development and nation-building.

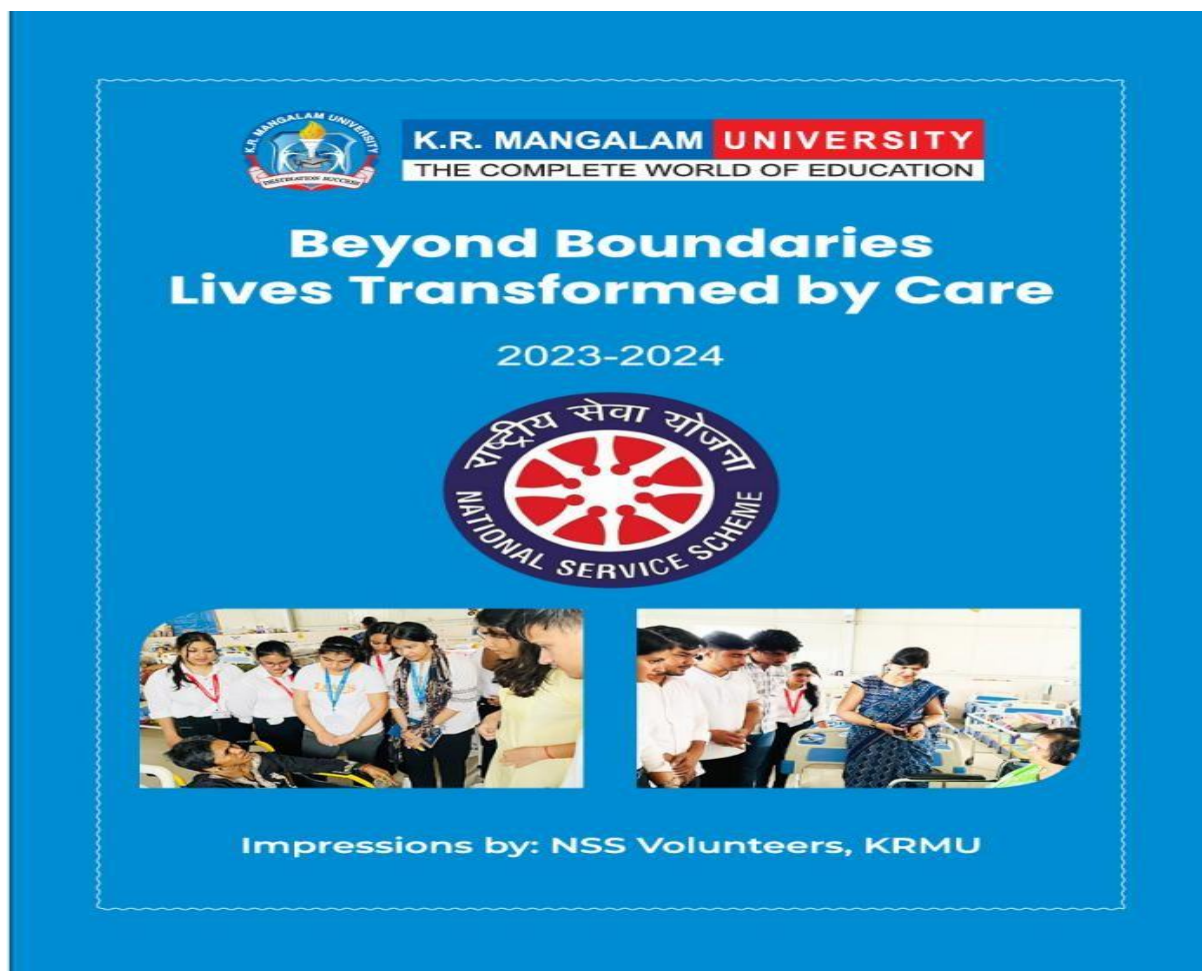

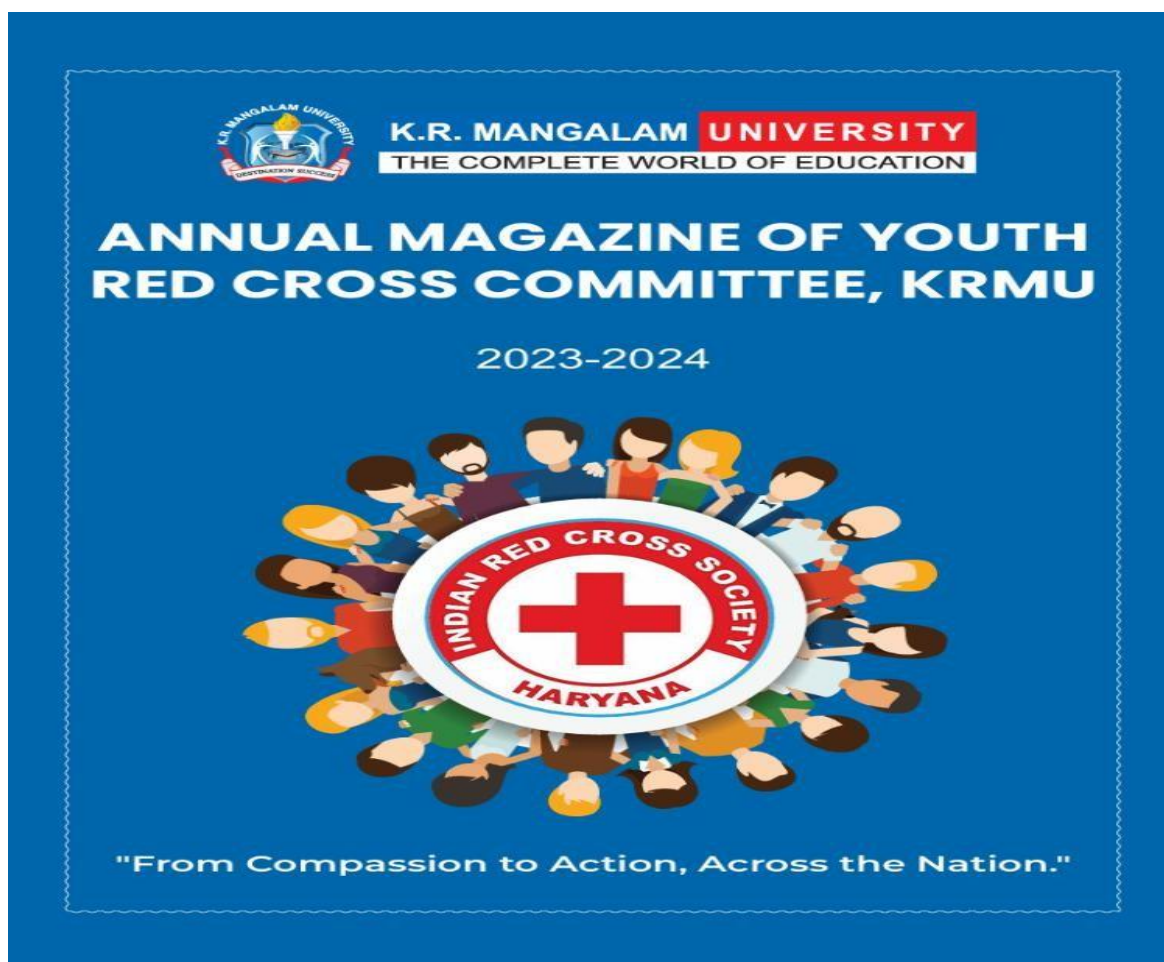

17.4.3 Education for SDGs in the Wider Community

K.R. Mangalam University demonstrates a strong commitment to SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) and community development by extending Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) beyond its campus and into the wider society. Rural outreach educational programs like bio-fertilizer training, post-harvest technology workshops, and Kisan Mela participation empower local farmers and youth, strengthening SDG 2 (Zero Hunger) through sustainable agriculture. Cyber security training, road safety



sensitization, and digital awareness workshops further promote responsible and safe citizenship aligned with SDG 16.

The University actively engages its alumni as knowledge partners, integrating them into community learning experiences and enhancing SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) through continued collaboration. These initiatives not only uplift local communities but also create experiential learning opportunities for students—strengthening civic responsibility, leadership, and social empathy.

Thus, KRMU plays a catalytic role in “Education for SDGs in the wider community” by combining awareness, capacity-building, social responsibility, and institutional partnerships, ensuring sustainable societal impact beyond the campus.

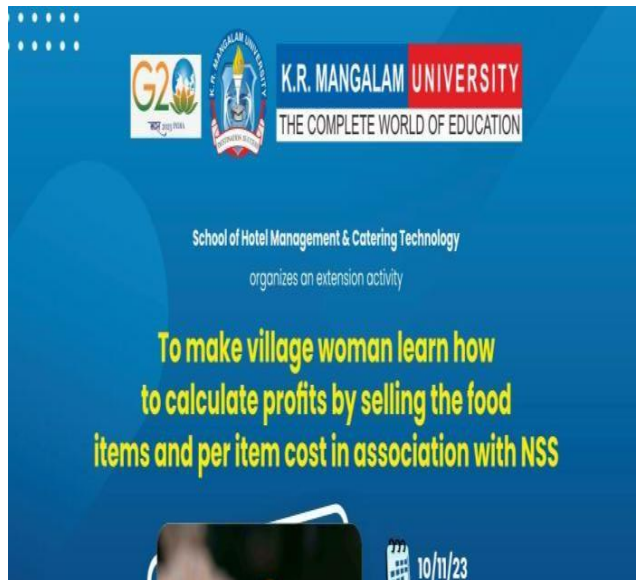

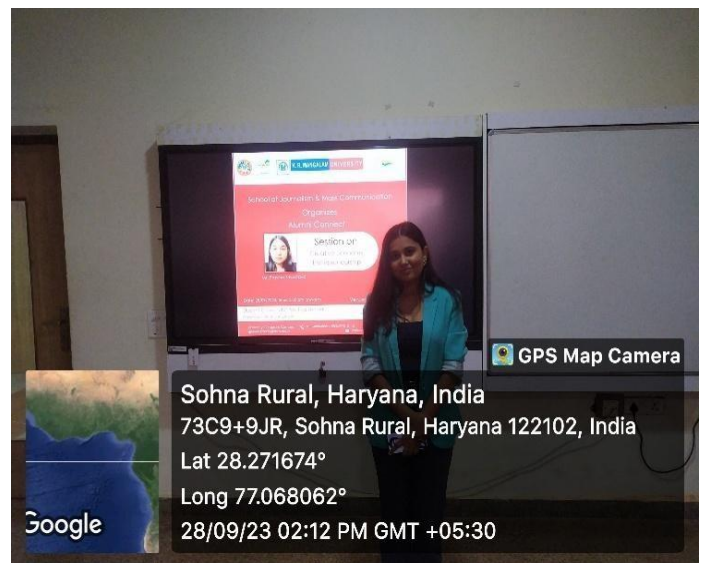

Support for Displaced & Migrant Communities

K.R. Mangalam University has undertaken several capacity-building and livelihood enhancement programmes that indirectly support internally displaced and migrant populations



in the Nuh–Gurugram peri-urban belt. Many of these communities face economic displacement due to loss of agriculture-based livelihood and seasonal migration for labor. Through financial inclusion projects, microfinance sensitization, legal identity documentation support, digital literacy training, and women-led entrepreneurship initiatives, the University ensures that vulnerable households gain access to economic opportunities and social entitlements.

Extension programmes such as Arogyam, women literacy drives, skill training for rural women, and sustainable agriculture workshops support rehabilitation of these communities by strengthening their self-reliance and socio-economic dignity. By improving access to health, livelihood, education and financial identity, KRMU contributes to SDG 10.7 (reduced inequalities for migrants/displaced) and SDG 17 (partnership-based outreach for vulnerable groups).

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17.4.4 Sustainability Literacy

K.R. Mangalam University (KRMU) actively integrates sustainability principles within its academic and institutional framework, aligning with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In particular, the University contributes to **SDG 17.4.4** by **assessing and enhancing the sustainability literacy** of its students ensuring they possess the knowledge, values, and skills necessary to act as responsible global citizens.

Sustainability Literacy refers to the ability of students to understand the interconnections between environmental, social, and economic systems, and to make informed decisions that support sustainable living and global well-being. At KRMU, sustainability literacy goes



beyond theoretical understanding, it is cultivated through practical exposure, critical thinking, and value-based learning experiences.

KRMU's Approach to Measuring Sustainability Literacy

Curriculum Integration

- Sustainability themes are woven into the curriculum across disciplines such as Environmental Studies, Business, Law, Architecture, and Social Sciences.
- Core courses introduce students to SDGs, environmental ethics, and sustainable community development.
- Case studies and problem-solving assignments assess students' ability to apply sustainability concepts in real-world contexts.

Sustainability Literacy Surveys and Assessments

- KRMU conducts **student surveys and feedback mechanisms** to gauge awareness and understanding of the SDGs.
- Periodic **knowledge assessments and reflection exercises** are organized to measure students' grasp of sustainability principles, global citizenship, and ethical leadership.
- The University tracks changes in sustainability literacy levels through pre- and post-program evaluations.

Experiential and Community Learning

- Through projects, field visits, and community engagement programs, students directly experience sustainability challenges and solutions.
- Initiatives such as waste management drives, plantation campaigns, financial literacy workshops, and health awareness programs help assess **applied sustainability knowledge**.
- Students reflect on these experiences through presentations and reports, providing measurable s of literacy growth.



Partnerships and Capacity Building

- KRMU collaborates with **NGOs, local communities, and sustainability organizations** to provide platforms for learning beyond the classroom.
- Joint initiatives such as sensitization programs on clean energy, gender equality, and rural development strengthen both understanding and commitment to sustainability values.
- Faculty and external experts co-evaluate student performance on sustainability-focused outcomes.

Research and Innovation

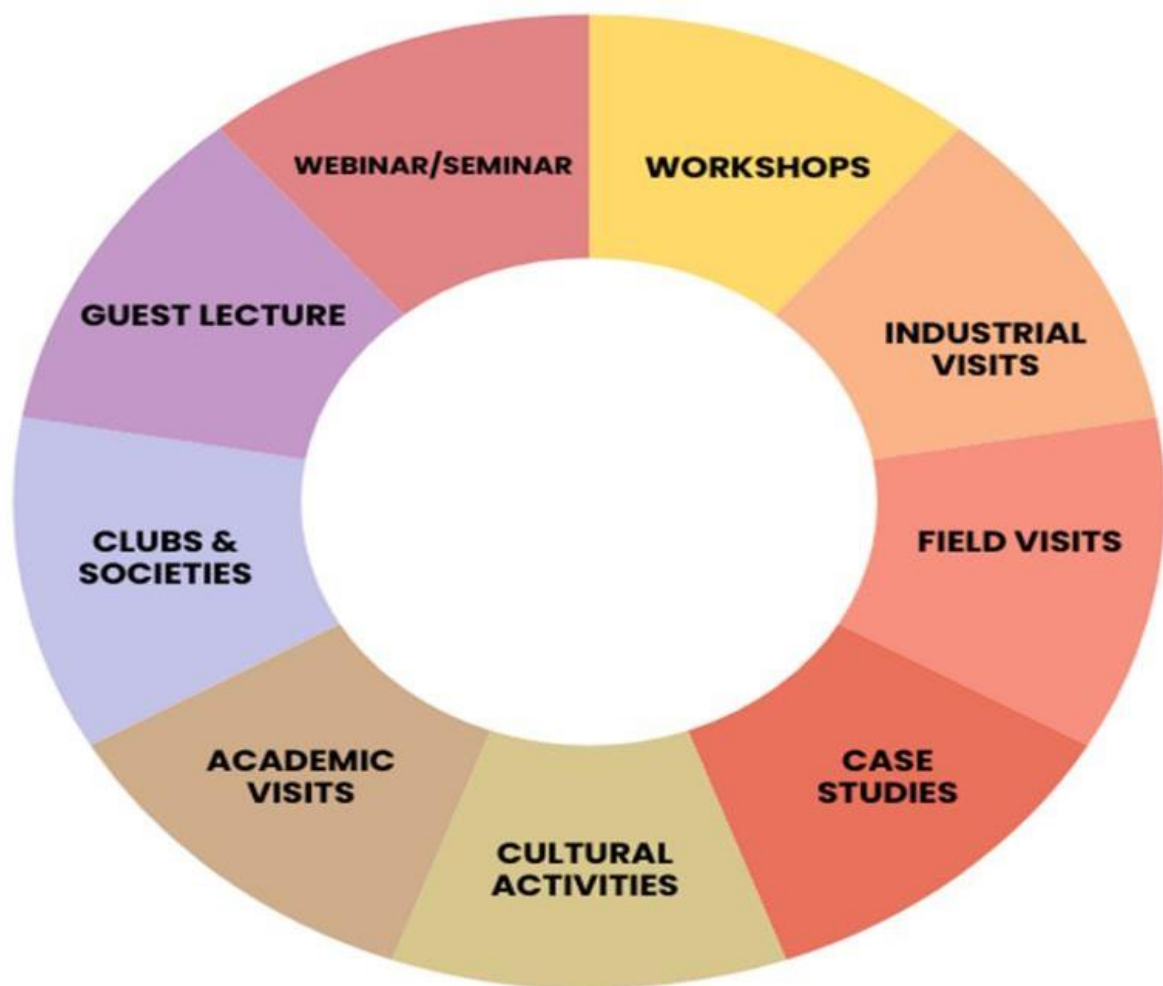
- Students are encouraged to undertake **research projects** addressing local and global sustainability challenges.
